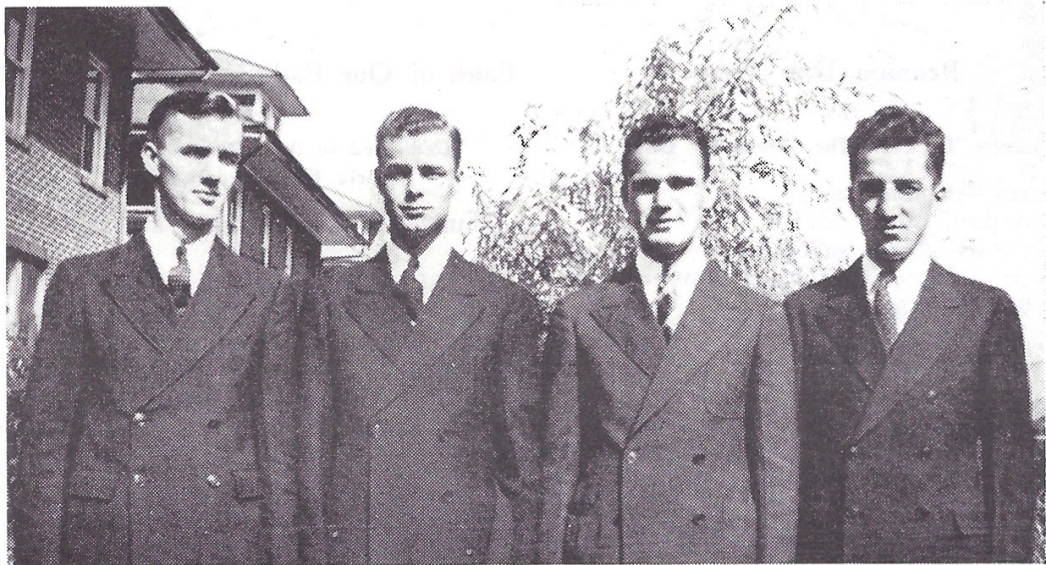

### REV. JOSEPH B. KULP, Guest Speaker

Rev. Joseph Bloomfield Kulp was born in Philadelphia, the son of Charles Wesley Kulp and Margaret Chestnut Kulp. He joined the New Jersey Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church and has been very active in the work of the ministry. He has served as pastor of churches at Bradley Beach, Camden, New Brunswick, Haddon Heights and Collingswood. At the two latter places, new churches were built during his pastorate. He was District Superintendent of the Bridgeton District for a full term of six years. Perhaps Rev. Kulp's greatest work has been among the young people of the Conference. He served on the faculty of Pennington Epworth League Institute for eight years and as Dean of the Institute for nine years. He is now pastor of Broad Street Park M. E. Church, Trenton. He has two children, Charles Ernest Kulp, a lawyer, of Camden, and Mrs. Marquerite Kulp Pratt of Merchantville.
