

These Two Churches Will Welcome Members of the Kulp Family

New Goshenhoppen Reformed Church (Upper left), East Greenville. Founded 1727. Rev. Calvin M. DeLong, D.D., Pastor. The name Conrad Colb appears in the first list of members during the pastorate of John Henry Goetschy, 1736-1739. During the pastorate of George Michael Weiss, beginning 1746, appear the names of Melchoir Kolb and George Michael Kolb. Since then the Kolb-Kulp name has been intimately associated with this church. Thirty-two members by this name are on the present church roll.

Lower Skippack Mennonite Church. Founded 1717. Rev. Henry M. Johnson, Pastor. Rev. Johnson represents the eighth generation of Pioneer Jacob Kolb who was one of the founders of this church. This is the second oldest Mennonite church in America. For many years the Treasurer of this church was John Kulp, father of Norman Kulp, our Reunion President.
