Joseph L. Prince.

A resident of Douglass Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, Mr. Joseph L. Prince was born in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, September 30, 1894, the son of Adolf Prince and Minnie Lukman Prince.

He attended the Pottstown Public Schools and graduated from the Pottstown High School, Class of 1911.

Later he attended the Wharton School of Commerce and Finance and the University of Pennsylvania Law School.

He graduated from Dickinson School of Law, June 7th, 1916, as President of the Class.

On February 19th, 1917, Mr. Prince was admitted to the Montgomery County Bar. A member of the Pennsylvania State Bar Association and the American Bar Association. He is also President of the Congregation of Mercy and Truth, Pottstown, Pa., since 1935.

Mr. Prince married Tillie Freedman, of Harrisburg, June 3rd, 1917. He served

Montgomery County as Solicitor to the County Controller for a period of thirteen years and was Solicitor to the Penna. State Association of County Controllers. Also acted as Solicitor to the Recorder of Deeds of Montgomery County for 12 years and to the Clerk of Courts for 7 years. Mr. Prince is Vice President of the Citizens National Bank and Trust Company of Pottstown, Pa.
