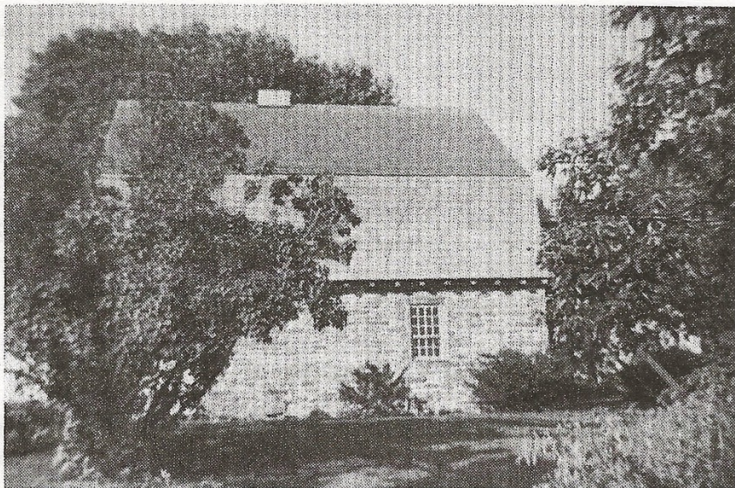

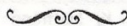
Residence of Pioneer Dielman Kolb,

The present dwelling erected of stone, indicates the replacement of the old house, the early part of the 18th Century.

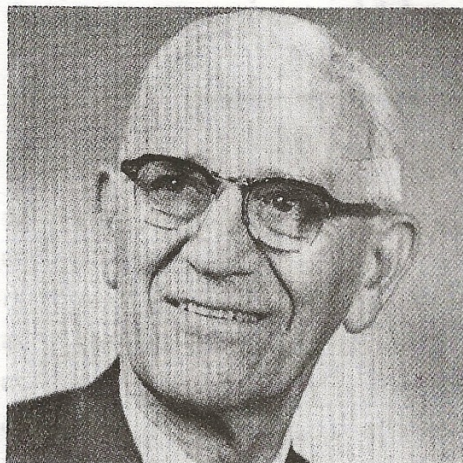

OUR GUEST SPEAKER

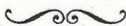


DR. H. STOVER KULP

The Kolb-Kulp-Culp Family Association feels highly honored today to have as the speaker, one of our own "Family" among the gathering here. We had the pleasure of having Rev. Kulp as a guest speaker on our program in 1936. We again welcome him in our midst today.

The early years of his ministry and life are well recorded in the 1936 program. Since Rev. Kulp returned to the mission field in North Nigeria, West Africa, in 1937, he served in all more than 40 years, teaching these people a

language in writing, translating the Bible and providing for them Christian Songs. After many years of Christian labor, he is now retired and returned to the States. To honor this pioneer missionary, the African people, whom he served, recently built a new Bible School and named it the "Kulp Bible School."
