The program this year is dedicated to the memory of Warren K. Schlotterer, Patriarch and leader of the Kolb-Kulp-Culp Family Association. Mr. Schlotterer passed away on the 17th of February, 1968, at the age of 86 years, having served our family association for a period of over forty years. He served as President, 1950 - 1952, as Treasurer for several years and as our tireless and inspiring Program Chairman for the past thirty-five years. In his passing the Family Association and all who knew him sustain a great loss.

Mr. Schlotterer was one of the pioneer historians and folklorists of Montgomery County and was always interested in the preservation of our great Pennsylvania Dutch heritage. 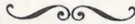

The Reverend Mr. Clarence R. Rohn is known throughout the eastern United States and beyond as one of the foremost representatives of the Pennsylvania German people and their culture. He is a director of the Pennsylvania German Society and is frequently called upon to address religious, civic and industrial groups on subjects relating to Pennsylvania German History, Religion, and Humor.

He was born and raised in Temple, Berks County, Pa., of Pennsylvania German ancestry, educated at Kutztown Teachers College, Albright College, Muhlenberg College, and the Lancaster Seminary of the Reformed Church (U.C.C.). He served his country in World War I, taught in the public schools, and since graduating from Seminary in 1923 has served as Pastor of the Jacksonville Reformed Charge, United Church of Christ, consisting of five Union Churches in Berks and Lehigh Counties.

The Singing Grandmothers are a group of Pennsylvania Dutch Grandmothers from the Telford area who have gained a wide reputation for traditional folk entertainment. They will present several humorous selections for us and several old time favorite hymns of the Pennsylvania Dutch people.
