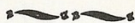

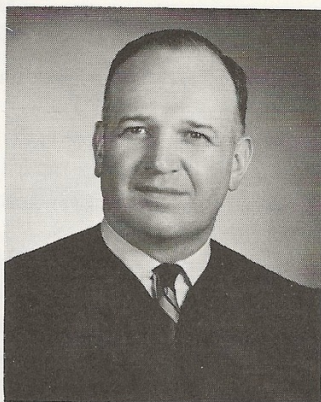

## OUR GUEST SPEAKER

The Honorable Richard S. Lowe, Judge of the Montgomery County Court of Common Pleas, is a lifelong resident of this County and has pursued a distinguished career here. Prior to coming to the bench, Judge Lowe was District Attorney and, for several years, Assistant District Attorney. He was a special Deputy Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; he is a member of the Montgomery County Bar, the Bars of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and of the Supreme Court of the United States. He is a graduate of Cheltenham High School, Temple University, and Temple University Law School, and he graduated from the



National College for State Trial Judges. He is a member of the Boards of Directors of the Montgomery County Chapter of the National Foundation March of Dimes and of the Family Service Association of Montgomery County. He is a member of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, Audubon, of Fritz Lodge No. 420, F.&A.M., and numerous other fraternal and civic organizations. He is the only Montgomery County official to have been honored twice, by the Fraternal Order of Police, for distinguished service to law enforcement. He was decorated with three battle stars and the Bronze Star for his service in World War II. Judge Lowe and his wife, the former Frances E. Steeley, have a son and a daughter; the family resides in West Norriton Township.
