A. Moyer Kulp, a retired Senior Vice President and Chairman of the Investment Committee for the Wellington Fund, died January 6, 1986. He was a member of the Kulp reunion committee from 1941 to 1982. Mr. Kulp was 90 years old.

The early life of the boy who was to become one of his generation's leaders began on a Mennonite Pennsylvania Dutch farm in Montgomery County. His one-room public school

house education was followed by a two-year course in a Philadelphia Business School and capped by serving 4 years, first as a private and ending as a first sergeant of the Marines. Next he studied at the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, graduating in 1922.

Mr. Kulp, formerly of Norristown, lived in the Pine Run Community. He retired in 1965 from his positions with the Wellington Management Co. and the Wellington Fund Group, but he remained a director until 1967. He was a past president of the Financial Analysts Society and was a charter president from 1961 to 1964 of the Institute of Chartered Financial Analysts.

He was a member of the Philadelphia Rotary Club, the Plymouth Country Club, Woodstock Country Club in Woodstock, VT, and the Union League of Philadelphia. He was also a member of the Newcomen Society and the Franklin Institute. After retirement, he enjoyed devoting more time to art, literature, travel, golf, fishing, and of course, the Kulp Family Reunion Committee.

His wife, Frances (Connelly) died February 24, 1986. Surviving are two sons, Charles M. of Fairfield, CT and Jonathan of Chester Springs, PA and a daughter, Susan, of Washington, DC and seven grandchildren.
