
SIXTY-THIRD ANNUAL REUNION

William Kulp (1811-1880) was the son of Henry Kulp of Lower Salford Township. Henry was a blue dyer by occupation but also engaged in the trades of woodworking, blacksmithing and farming. In 1802, he bought a farm near the corner of Kulp Road and Sumneytown Pike at Harleysville, He married Susanna Moyer and fathered several children, one of whom was William.

William first appears in the 1834 Lower Salford tax records as a singleman. Apparently this lifestyle suited him for he remained a bachelor for many years. In 1850, his father died and William bought the family farm. He shared this residence with his 75-year-old mother and tax records show his occupation as clock and watchmaker, jeweler and farmer.

William's mother died in 1860 and shortly thereafter he married Mary Fredrick, a young maid-servant of the household. They had four daughters and a son. He is believed to be a cousin to clockmaker Jacob D. Moyer and also related to clockmaker Jacob Hagey, Jr. He is buried at Lower Salford Mennonite Church.

MR. BRUCE R. FORMAN

Mr. Bruce Forman is a mechanical engineer at Bethlehem Steel and an apprenticed clockmaker. He is a member of the American Watchmakers Institute and the National Association of Watch and Clock Collectors. He has published many technical and historical articles concerning clocks and clockmaking. His most recent publication was a monograph documenting the clockmakers and clocks contained in the collections of the Historical Society of Montgomery County.



Mr. Forman is currently writing a book about the more than one hundred clockmakers who worked in Montgomery County before 1850. He is systematically photographing examples of clocks made in this county and uses a home computer to document his research.
