

His careers as agricultural educator, seed salesman and college professor have exposed him to farms in the upper mid-West. Dr. Avery collected agricultural history and graduate degrees in Wisconsin and Illinois. He came to New Britain Township in 1985 as Chairman of Agribusiness at Delaware Valley College, Doylestown. In July 1992 he was given the opportunity of directing the development of the Kolb Homestead in Upper Gwynedd Township. On May 14, 1993 the site was dedicated as the Abraham and Edythe Roth Living Museum. His wife, Marsha, shares his enthusiasm for cultural preservation.
