### **Kolbs In The American Immigration Stream**

As we celebrate the arrival of our Kolb ancestors 290 years ago from the Palatinate region in Germany let's review some of the pertinent factors that help us understand and relate to our Kolb-Kulp-Culp Family Reunion today.

In the summer of 1682 Francis Daniel Pastorius, accompanied by Jacob Schumacher, who was an agent of William Penn, preceded an immigrant group of 13 families to America. This group of 33 people later sailed from England aboard the vessel "Concord" on July 24th, 1683. They arrived in Philadelphia on October the 6th. As Mennonites and Quakers this was the first group of immigrants to settle the area that is now called Germantown.

Peter Schumacher, the brother of Jacob Schumacher, departed for America in 1685 with three of his five daughters and a son Peter Jr. The 5th daughter, Agnes was married to Dielman Kolb, Sr. She was the mother of our four Kolb ancestors. They emigrated in 1707. A fifth son, Dielman, Jr. followed in 1717. The 6th son, Peter, Jr. and a daughter, Ann, remained in Wolfsheim, Germany.

It must have been a traumatic experience for these folks to forsake their native Rhine country known as the garden of Germany. Their houses were comfortable, their barns and stables were stocked with horses and cattle and their crops were plentiful. But because of their beliefs they were subjected to harsh persecution and unjust treatment. In America they could establish a refugee colony and practice their religious beliefs in peace and harmony.

As more immigrants arrived some moved further up the Schuylkill and Perkiomen Rivers and settled in such locations as Skippack. It is interesting to note that although English is the language spoken across America there are still some descendents that can speak their native tongue (the Pfalsich, now called Pennsylvania-Dutch).

### GOSCHENHOPPEN FOLK FESTIVAL

History will repeat itself at the Goschenhoppen Folk Festival on Friday, August 8 and Saturday, August 9, in East Greenville, PA. Offering a unique, authentic and educational re-creation of the life and customs of the Pennsylvania Dutch in the 18th and 19th centuries, the Festival is sponsored by the Goschenhoppen Historians.

Committed to folk cultural authenticity, the Goschenhoppen Historians create an atmosphere which will captivate those who already love history and stir an interest in those unfamiliar with past customs. Over 1000 participants from all ages re-enact a myriad of activities and tasks of the Pennsylvania Dutch people of one and two hundred years ago. Trade skills like potters, organ making, chair caning and pump boring will be demonstrated by the men while the women portray various tasks like food preparation, sewing and mending, weaving tape and spinning, and corn husk doll making. Live animals are included to make the atmosphere all the more convincing.

"Domestic Fowl" is the theme for the 1997 Festival. Festival folk in period costume will demonstrate old time practices related to the care and keeping of chickens, ducks, guinea fowl, geese and other barnyard fowl on the homestead. Visitors will see how the Pennsylvania Dutch made use of every part of their farm fowl including cooking with eggs and meat, using down and feathers for bedding, and medicinal use of the fat from the birds. Festival participants will demonstrate how Easter egg decorating was done in the early 19th century.

Gather your family and friends and take a trip back in time. You may not leave with the answer to the age old question, "Which came first, the chicken or the egg?" but chances are that after a day at the festival you'll be wishing you could ride home on a horse and buggy, and you'll be listening for the rooster the next morning.

The 31st Annual Goschenhoppen Historians Folk Festival will take place on Friday, August 8 and Saturday, August 9 at the New Goschenhoppen Park on 3rd St. in East Greenville, just off Route 29 in northern Montgomery County. The Festival runs from 12:00 noon to 8:00 p.m. on Friday and 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, rain or shine. Visitors donate \$6.00; admission is free for children 12 and under.
