



Our Speaker: DR. JOHN L. RUTH
Topic: A Family History

Dr. John Landis Ruth, born in 1930, lives on his eight-generation maternal homestead in Montgomery County. He is a graduate of Eastern College and Harvard University with a Ph.D. in English and American Literature. Dr. Ruth has taught English at Eastern College and the University of Hamburg, Germany. In 1975, he turned to directing film and video documentaries. Included among his many projects is a film documentary: "The Amish: A People of Preservation." Among his books is "Twas Seeding Time: A Mennonite View of the American Revolution." Dr. Ruth has traveled extensively and annually leads tours to Europe related to history. For two decades he served as Associate Minister of the Salford Mennonite congregation near Harleysville. Having retired from the ministry in 1993, he continues on the Board of the Mennonite Historians of Eastern Pennsylvania, while preparing a multi-volume narrative interpretation of Mennonite Life in the Lower Salford/Franconia region and most recently, a history of the Lancaster County Mennonites.






Family Coat of Arms November 20th 1578



COUSINS

The 75th reunion of the Kolb/Kulp/Culp Family Association will be held at the Lower Skippack Mennonite Church. This is the church most closely associated with the Mennonite Kolb brothers, sons of Dielman Kolb of Wolfsheim. Most of our members are descendants of either these brothers or the Reformed Kolbs who came from Meckesheim and settled near the New Goshenhoppen Church at E. Greenville. We have many members who descend from other Kolb immigrants such as the Lutheran Matthias Kolb who arrived in 1744 or Hans Casper Kolb who came with the Brethren leader Alexander Mack in 1729. These Kolbs were all here before 1750, but many Kolbs came to America in the last 250 years and we probably heave some descendants of later Kolbs on our mailing list.

The late Abram Hunsicker was the official genealogist for the Kolb/Kulp?Culp Family Association for many years and left us a very extensive file of known relationships and descendants. I am in the process of building a computer database from those files and the work of the late Bill Moyer who was president of the association and had constructed an earlier version from these files. I am hoping that many members will submit updated information of their Kolb/Kulp/Culp ancestors to add to our files. This computer database will be available for reference at the Mennonite Heritage Center in Harleysville, PA along with other Kolb/Kulp/Culp files.

SPECIAL CULTURAL OPPORTUNITY


It is with great pleasure that your 75TH REUNION will host a collection of unusual folkart painting and fraktur art. We are appreciative for the lending of these premier historic paintings from the collection of the Mennonite Heritage Center, private collection and the artists.

Fraktur, as related to an art form, means "Fractured Writing". The artists in continental Europe and America, greatly enhanced the art forms development. Highly prized documents including marriage and birth announcements, wood work, even bookplates were decorated in fraktur designs. The two artists represented at the 75th Reunion are ROMA J. RUTH and ISAAC CLARENCE KULP. Roma Ruth's authentic Pennsylvania German fraktur designs are unique examples of this art form. Clarence Kulp's pictures are truly representations of the history and philosophy of the early settles in folkart presentations.

DUNKER BAPTISMAL SERVICE AT THE BRANCHVILLE BRIDGE

Isaac Clarence Kulp, Jr. September 21, 1996, No. 209

The Indian Creek Dunker Congregation, though usually baptizing at various sites in the Indian Creek, occasionally over the years held baptizings in the East Branch of the Perkiomen, near Branchville, now Bergey, Penna. Because of lower water levels in the Indian Creek, this was the regular baptismal site in the late 1940's and early 1950's. The artist was baptized here, near this bridge, in the mid-1940's, in the month of January.
