** Gary Kulp asked if the location of the Cassel Farm was known. There was a brief mention of the Cassel farm in a newspaper article mentioning its sale, but did not specify it's location. A quick google map search found a Cassel Rd located near the Lower Skippack Mennonite Church. Just to the east of the church, is an intersection with Miller Rd, where if you travel northwest for about a half mile, you will come across a Cassel Rd on the left. Traveling down that road you come to a development that contains Daniel and Julian Drives. So, I might, badly, assume that is where the farm might have been.

** Daryl Culp sent a follow-up to my postulating about another Kolb brother, Arnold, who appears to have died soon after he arrived in 1709:

There is a note by another researcher: "This is speculative son of Dielman Kolb. The name appeared on emigration list in 1709 (age 22, so born c 1687), travelling with (possible brother) Henry. It's also possible this was a nephew or some other relative, not a son of Dielman.

They had to change the C to a K to meet FCC requirements, i.e. radio stations east and west of the Mississippi had call letters beginning with 'W' and 'K', respectively.
